"SIT in Action"

The Seychelles Institute of Technology will open its doors to the general public, parents, secondary schools students, students from other Professional Centres and its partners in industry on Friday 6th November 2015 at Providence Industrial Estate from 9:00 am to 2:30 pm.

The Open Day is aimed at show-casing the activities that go on at SIT on a normal training day. Visitors will have the opportunity to observe practical activities in both the workshops and around the campus by students on the different programmes. A rain water storage arrangement will be exhibited in the Plumbing workshop. There will also be on sale woodwork products such as flush doors, stools, coconut scrapers (larap koko) in the Carpentry Workshop.

The theme for this year's Open Day is "SIT in Action". This theme is to remind all potential learners, students and the general public, that SIT is that Professional Centre which leads learners to acquire practical skills, expertise and understanding, necessary for employment in a the different domains of Engineering, Built Environment and Telecommunication.

SIT is celebrating its 10th year of establishment and it is fitting for the Professional Centre to demonstrate how far it has reached in training of the Seychellois youth and in development of its training capacity.

The highlights of the day will be the launching of the SIT New Website (www.sit.sc) and the unveiling of the First ever SIT Ten-year Souvenir Magazine, copies of which will be presented to dignitaries during the Opening ceremony. The Souvenir magazine will then go on sale to SIT staff and students, past and present.
